# 1st XI Hockey 2021-2022

This season has been one of great success for Bromley High's 1st XI Hockey team. A season in which we were crowned GDST Trust Champions, Kent County Champions and England Hockey Regional and National Champions.

We started the season focused on playing attacking high tempo, fast paced hockey. With a mixture of experienced players and a couple of younger members from year 11, we quickly gelled and knew that we would have to work together as a team to exceed the expectations we set for ourselves.

Our first match of the season was a friendly, away at James Allen's Girls School. Although this ended as one of our few losses (1-2), it was the perfect opportunity to learn a little about each other and plan for the season ahead. Having learnt from this, when Streatham and Clapham High paid us a visit, we dominated from push back and stole an easy (4-0) win.

A week later we were off to Charterhouse School, Guildford for the GDST Regionals. Great performances by everyone, and very little nerves saw us dominate all 4 of our matches against Wimbledon High (2-0), Croydon High (1-0), Sydenham High (5-0) and a rematch with Streatham and Clapham High (2-1). Three of our players racked up an impressive 10 goals and we only conceded one. It left us feeling super confident, which set the tone for the rest of the season and it meant we qualified for the GDST Trust Finals.

Next came the Kent County Cup hosted by Sevenoaks School. Always a tournament full of nerves as only the winners and runners up from the 11 teams competing would progress to the regional finals with a chance to make the National Finals. With a full day of competitive matches only 20 minutes one way there is little room for errors.

We let nerves get the better of us in our first match against Cranbrook, but thanks to Alice Gigney, Evie Prentice and Charlotte Bruce we kept our defence strong and the match ended as a 0-0 draw. A change

in tactics to attack harder in the D and keep the ball moving more allowed us to see off our next 2 group matches with convincing wins against St Dunstan's college (6-0) and The King's School Canterbury (7-0).

After the previous 2 high scoring matches our final group match against Ashford was a tight affair, but thankfully with only 20 seconds before the final whistle I scored a field goal to give us a 1-0 win.

Being top of the group we then faced a lower ranking Benenden in the quarterfinals. Feeling increasingly confident we had fun on the pitch, moving the ball around effortlessly with the Carr sisters (Jemma and Olivia) linking up well on the right, allowing us to score 5 goals for another impressive 5-0 win.

Back to business in the Semi-finals where we were up against Sevenoaks School. With a long history of rivalry between the 2 schools we knew this would be a difficult match. Both teams showed some early nerves as the ball moved from end to end. Rita Huang was incredible, working hard in goal and the pressure mounted until we managed to secure a 1-0 win courtesy of Sofia Ouarbya who has an amazing ability to score under pressure.

The Final saw us meet Cranbrook again. With both teams being worthy of the title we had a tight game where everyone fought well for every ball and no goals were conceded by either team. This meant it came down to penalty flicks! Both sides looked optimistic as their penalty takers stepped up, but not only did we have Alice, Poppy and myself scoring our flicks, we had the awesome Rita manning the goal who made two blinding saves making it a 3-2 win and we travelled home with our first trophy of the year and as **Kent County Champions**.

With our ever-growing confidence a week later, we had an early 6am departure to Nottingham High School for the finals of the GDST Trust rally. Nine GDST schools had progressed through from their Regionals to compete for the chance to win the coveted GDST trophy - which was last on display in the BHS trophy

cabinet in 2017. Group matches against Howells School, where we performed skilful short corners for a 5-0 win, a close match against Wimbledon High going down 1-0 in the first half but bringing it back for a 2-1 win and an easy win vs Nottingham High (5-0) meant we scored 12 goals and conceded just one. During these matches Sasha Kelbrick and Susannah Williams really showed their worth and contributed massively to the team.

Topping the group meant we advanced to the semi-finals to play Norwich High. Great team play gave our trio of forwards a chance to make it an amazing 4-0 win. The whole team were very clinical and had a very strong press which didn't allow Norwich out of our attacking half very often. This moved us on to the finals to once again face Wimbledon High. This time keeping a clean sheet with strong defending from Alice, Sofia Elliot and Louise Coley we secured a 2-0 win and travelled home with another trophy and the title of GDST Trust Rally Champions.

Three friendly matches with Langley Boys, Colfes and St Dunstan's then allowed some junior players to step up and enjoy some pitch time and gave a few of us a short break to work on our skills before the National Cup Regional Finals at Caterham School and time to focus on some indoor play ready for the Super 6's County Championships.

Indoor is always thrilling to both watch and play. It is full of speed, intensity and full of adrenaline. At the Kent County Cup Championships, a one-day event in Canterbury, 4 group matches allowed us a solid 5-0 win v Langley, we dispatched Cranbrook (2-0) and The Kings College Canterbury (3-0) with our skills and ability to smash most short corners into the back of the goal and a goalless match against Sevenoaks. These matches placed us top of our group and we headed into the Quarter final against Ashford School. Each player looked comfortable on the ball showing great composure and control to win 3-1 (the only goal we conceded all day).

We then faced Sevenoaks School again in the semis. Knowing the victory would put the winner in the finals the game was evenly poised, tight and hard fought, but once again ended goalless and went to flicks. Sadly, we lost by one. Such a small margin, but enough to put us into the 3rd place play off with Kent College. Super play in this match meant we left with a 1-0 win.

Well, done to our small indoor squad of Rita, Florence, Jemma, Olivia, Alice, Sasha, Poppy (and myself) for

a great day of indoor hockey.

Back to outdoor hockey, at the Regional Finals we took on Croydon High, Cranbrook and Caterham (which was one of my favourite matches of the season). As all 4 teams had already progressed from their County Championships both the standard and the stakes were high. Every match counted - only the top placed team would go to the Nationals. The tournament was held on a Wednesday afternoon which meant that despite the cold weather most of Caterham's 6th form was on the terraces to watch which added to the excitement. Our 1st match of the day against Croydon High was a solid 4-0 win.

We had to work extremely hard in a tight second match with Caterham. But the attitude and determination of every member of the team showed throughout this game like nothing I have seen before. We had such a desire to win and the refusal to accept defeat carried the team over the line with a gritty 1-0 win after I struck a reverse hit at goal, which was saved on the line by a Caterham defender, only for Olivia Carr to get on the rebound and flick the ball in the goal.

Clearly a threat in our last match of the day against Cranbrook, the only goal in the second half gave us another win, meaning these 3 victories secured the team a place in the England Hockey tier 4 National Finals in February.


February finally arrived and it was time to head to Nottingham in our smart new kit. Most of the team had already had the honour of playing in the U16s National Finals when we took home the bronze medals. But now was the time to firmly put Bromley High School's name on the champion's board.

Although it was not without drama. Covid decided to play havoc. The news that our Captain, Alice Gigney was unable to join us due to a positive Covid test sent us all in a panic, which was then further added to when Evie also tested positive. With only 11 players now on the team sheet we were thankful to year 11 Jess Matthews for stepping into Evie's kit (literally) and heading to Nottingham to join the squad. (Alice later got a negative PCR test enabling her to join us.)

As always, the atmosphere at a National Final was buzzing. The terraces were full of spectators including our parents, teachers and Mrs Drew, who had all made the overnight trip to support us. We powered through the group stage without conceding a goal beating Worksop College (3-0), Austin Friars (5-0) and Notting Hill and Ealing High School (1-0) putting us at the top of the group. Throughout all the matches Sasha and Poppy ran tirelessly in the midfield and the dedication and commitment shown by Alice and Susannah in defence meant our keeper was able to remain relaxed and ready for the final match of the day.

The top team of each group then faced each other to play for the title. Hill House proved to be a formidable opposition but our whole team worked extraordinarily hard and showed great determination in what was our most physical game ever. There were chances at both ends that kept the crowd on their feet, but a lack of

concentration allowed Hill House to take the lead with a goal in the first half before Sasha drew level with a skilful run down the middle to finish with a goal scoring strike that left her lying prone in the D. Although tired everyone showed an outstanding work ethic and gave it all they had. With 30 seconds to go and the thought of going to penalty flicks drawing ever closer, a short corner was awarded in our favour, and then the final whistle was blown. I knew as the striker that this was my moment. A neat and fast injection allowed me the time and space to beat the number 1 defender with my skills and have a flick at goal. However, the Hill House keeper, also knowing it was her moment, did everything she could to save it. With the ball now in the air and an overcrowded D, the pressure was on to keep the ball from leaving the D. Poppy got on the end of the rebound and had a strike at goal, which again was saved by the Hill House keeper, but her clearance was not strong enough and we were awarded with a third chance with which Louise Coley managed to score her first 1st XI goal exactly when it mattered - Bromley High School's 1st XI Hockey Team became England Hockey Tier 4 2022 National Champions!
