The violence, racism and misogyny of classic Westerns, packaged into a slick Hollywood sheen, leaves a bitter taste in the mouth today. As Rita Keresztesi writes, Westerns are 'the quintessential visual vehicle of American imperialist myth-making and rugged individualism'. Love them or hate them, their impact on our collective consciousness is undeniable. The town of Nowhere is therefore our attempt to address these contradictions, to take what we love and leave the rest behind.

Ralph Lamar Turner writes that Westerns are 'often employed, to examine current problems through the lens of past dilemmas.' What problem could be more current than that of oil? At a time when big oil companies are posting record profits as the world crumbles around them, it felt fitting to use the Western

genre to look back to the industry's relatively recent and humble beginnings. To a time when two brothers named their business "Shell" after the seashell jewellery boxes their father used to sell. To a time when a new morality was born, and with it a set of difficult choices for normal people swept up in the tide of progress.

But most importantly the Western is a popular genre, and *Nowhere, Sometime* is gloriously, unashamedly popular theatre. We want to ask important questions but above all, The Vengeful Bucket and I want to tell a rootin' tootin' tale that our mothers, grandfathers and mates who don't usually go to the theatre can enjoy. We hope that you enjoy today's show, and we hope that you'll leave itching to book a ticket for another experience at the theatre as soon as possible.
