Primary Mathematics Challenge

Last week a large number of pupils in Year 6 took part in the National Primary Mathematics Challenge. This is a fun and exciting mathematical challenge aimed at pupils across the United Kingdom.

The PMC paper has 25 questions, 20 of which are multiple choice. The questions are graded; starting with easy ones and graduating to harder questions.
