
## **Foundation**

The 'Move Up' morning on Thursday was very exciting. The children explored their new classrooms and returned to Foundation later in the morning excited and feeling particularly grown-up! We hope that you were able to meet your child's Year 1 teacher on the afternoon of 20<sup>th</sup> June.

For the rest of the week the children have been working as normal. They have been writing a traditional story, carrying out a pollution survey and using paint programs on the computer to draw an animal. We also loved FLW's assembly and the re-telling of the story of the story of The Enormous Turnip. We got to see how much the children have grown over the year – 7cm was about the average!

In Maths this week, the children have focusing on measuring. They have been measuring mass and length using non-standard units.

For homework, we would like the children to think about this problem. Show the children the picture and tell them: These drawings were found in La Pileta cave, in Spain and could be up to 25000 years old.



## Ask them:

- What do you think these drawings represent?
- Could they be about counting things?
- What might 'stone-age' people count?
- Might they be the earliest known number patterns?
- Could you try and make up your own way of recording counting?
