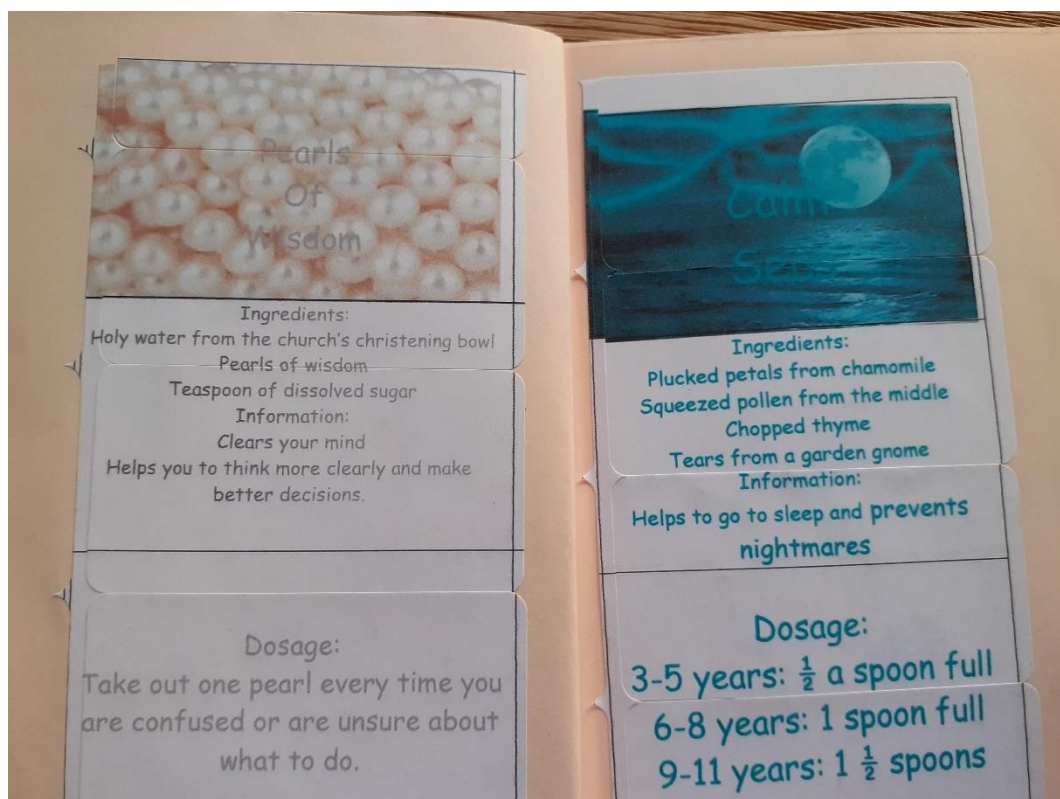


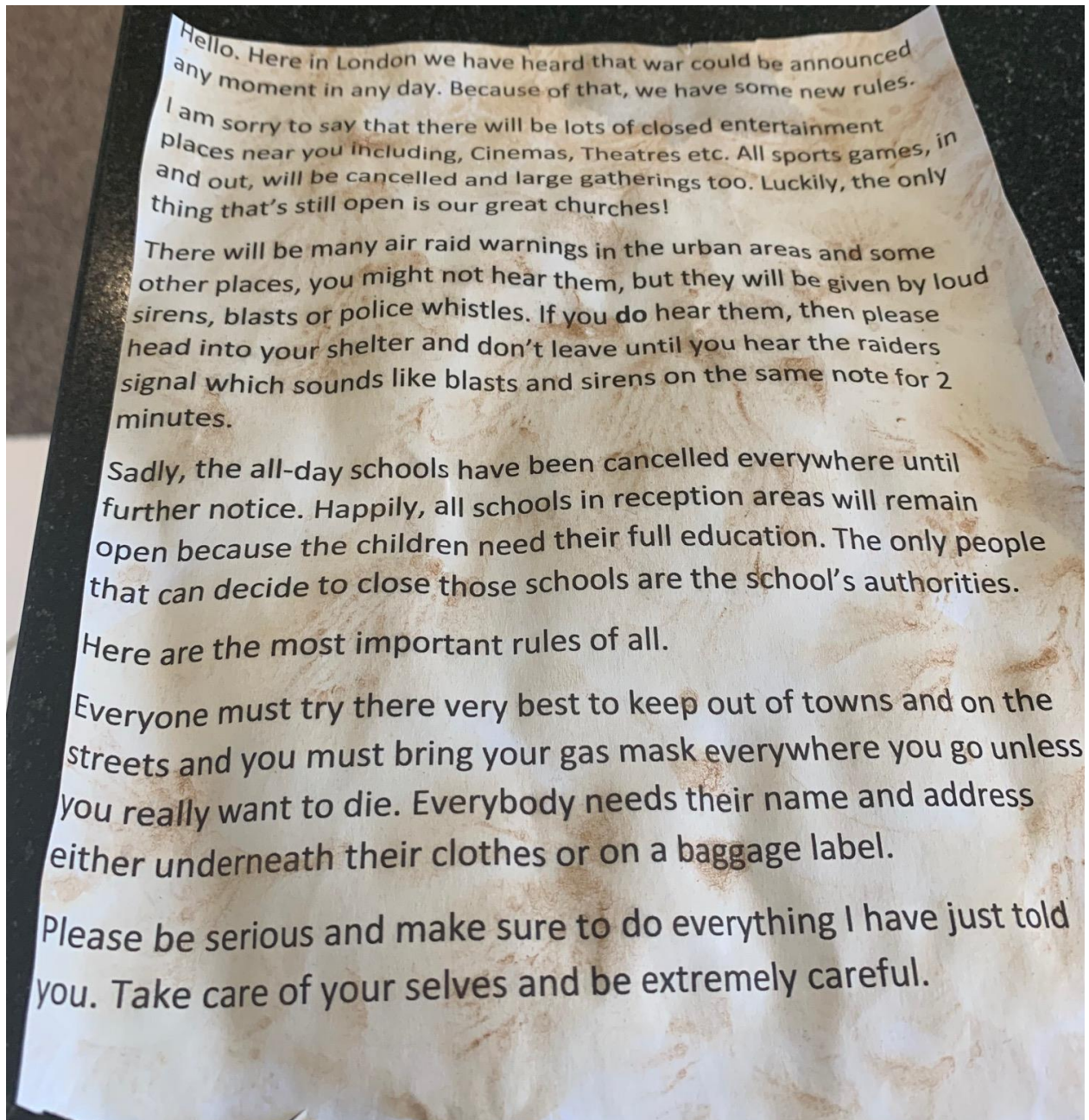
6F Study Goodnight Mister Tom

Pupils in 6F were asked to come up with some medicines to help a character from Goodnight Mister Tom recover psychologically from a troubled past.

Here is an example of Juliette's work. She took the idea on board and designed an entire medicine cupboard, filled with wonderful medicines to heal the mind and calm the soul.



Here are two examples of War Time Instructions, by Grace and Ada, which the pupils of 6F produced after listening to Neville Chamberlain's speech to announce the Second World War. They were asked to make notes and then write up an instruction leaflet for the villagers, and to look out for (and highlight if possible) those instructions which were similar to the 'Lockdown' directions we are following at this time.



War with Germany:

Here is some information that should be followed in these unpredictable times.

Places of entertainment:

All cinemas and places of entertainment are to be closed. However, it may be possible to allow the reopening of such places in some areas. They are closed as if a bomb were to be dropped on such a place, large numbers of people could be killed or injured.

All sports and large gathering for purposes of entertainment and amusement, either outdoor or indoor, are to be prohibited from now and people are requested to not crowd unnecessarily in any circumstances.

Churches and other places of worship will stay open.

Air raid warnings:

No siren or hooter may be sounded except on the instructions of the police. In the event of an air raid, warnings will be given in urban places by siren or by hooter which will be sounded in some places by short blasts and in other places by warbling notes that change every second.

If you hear this go to a shelter immediately and do not leave until you hear the raiders past signal which will be given by sounding the sirens or hooters on the same note for a period of two minutes.

If poison gas is used, you will be informed by hand rattles. If you hear hand rattles do not leave the shelter until the poison smoke has been cleared away. You will know this as hand bells will be sounded.

Schools:

All day schools in England, Wales and Scotland are to be closed for lessons for at least a week from today.

In reception areas, schools should be reopened as soon as arrangements of the education of evacuated children can be completed.

The precise date of the reopening of schools in reception areas will be decided by the authorities of the school.

General:

Keep off the streets as much as possible to avoid exposing yourself unnecessarily to danger. Always carry your gas mask with you at all times.

Children able to run about must have names and addresses clearly written with them. Do this on luggage or something like that not an odd piece of paper that can easily get lost.
