

Who killed Jesus? (and other work!)




Alice's Viewpoint


I think that the solidity of God's plan was the most important cause of Jesus' death.




An Extract from Daisy's Viewpoint

Task 5C Produce a bar graph to show **WHO KILLED JESUS**.





I think that the weakness of the Pilate is also especially important in Jesus' death.



I think that the fact that he had the chance to save him makes the Pilate one of the main reasons for the death of Jesus.




An extract from Emily B's viewpoint






I chose God first. Jesus said that it was all part of God's big plan for Jesus to die. So therefore God was the one who chose Jesus to die so he is held most responsible.

Harriet's Viewpoint



However, God is more responsible for Jesus' death than the Religious Leaders because he planned it to happen, and the Religious Leaders just influenced people to kill him.






