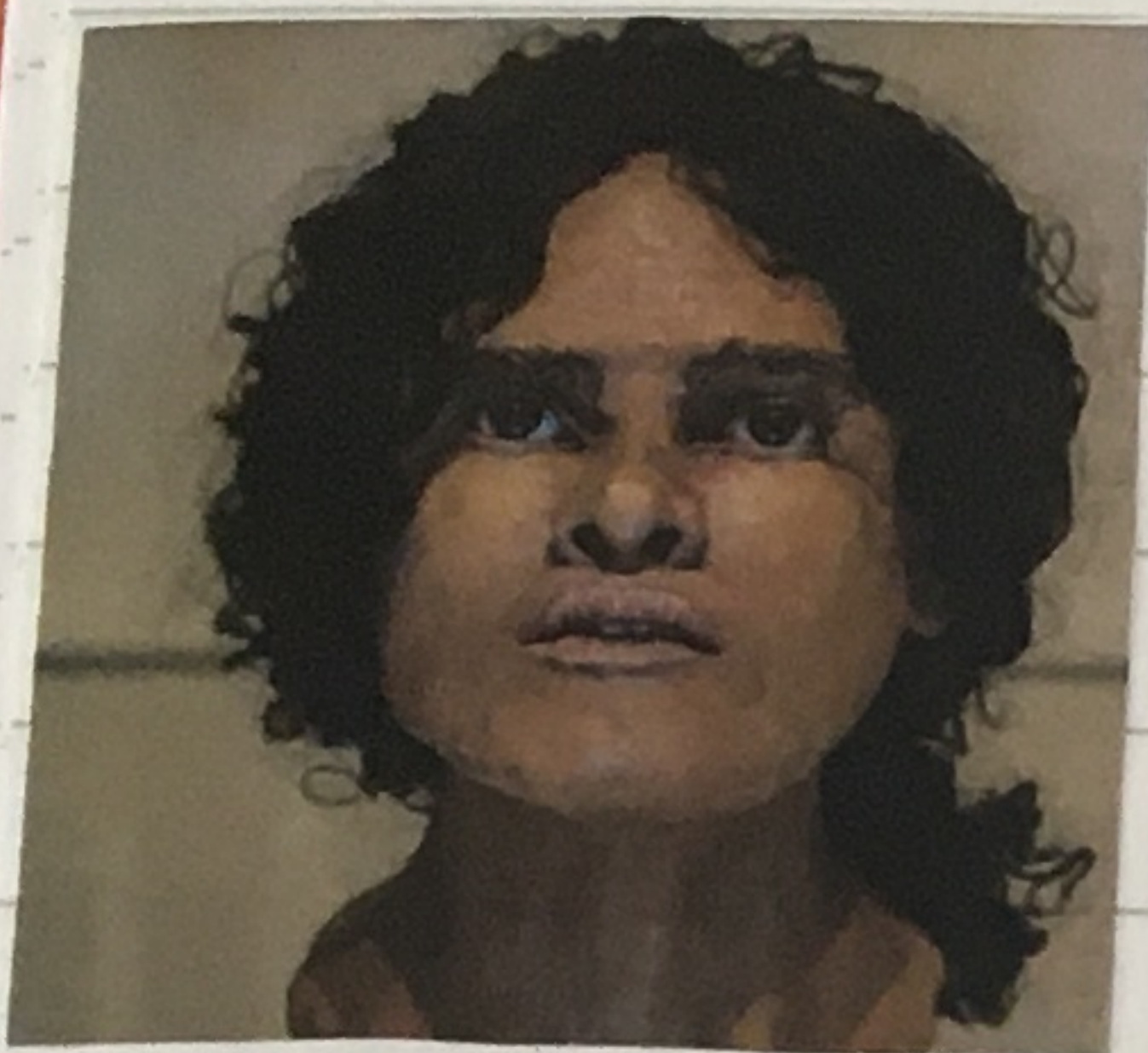

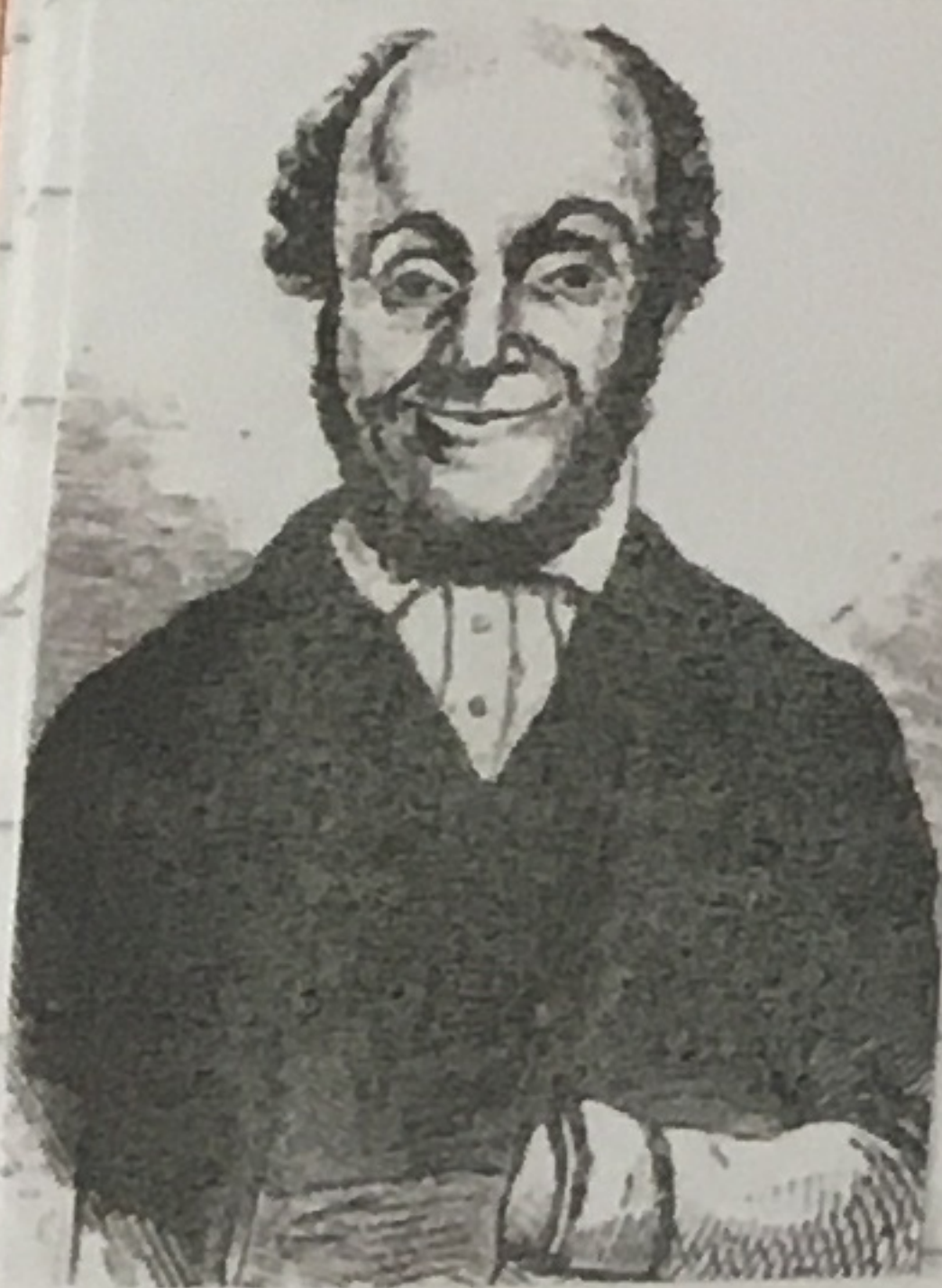

History of Black Britons

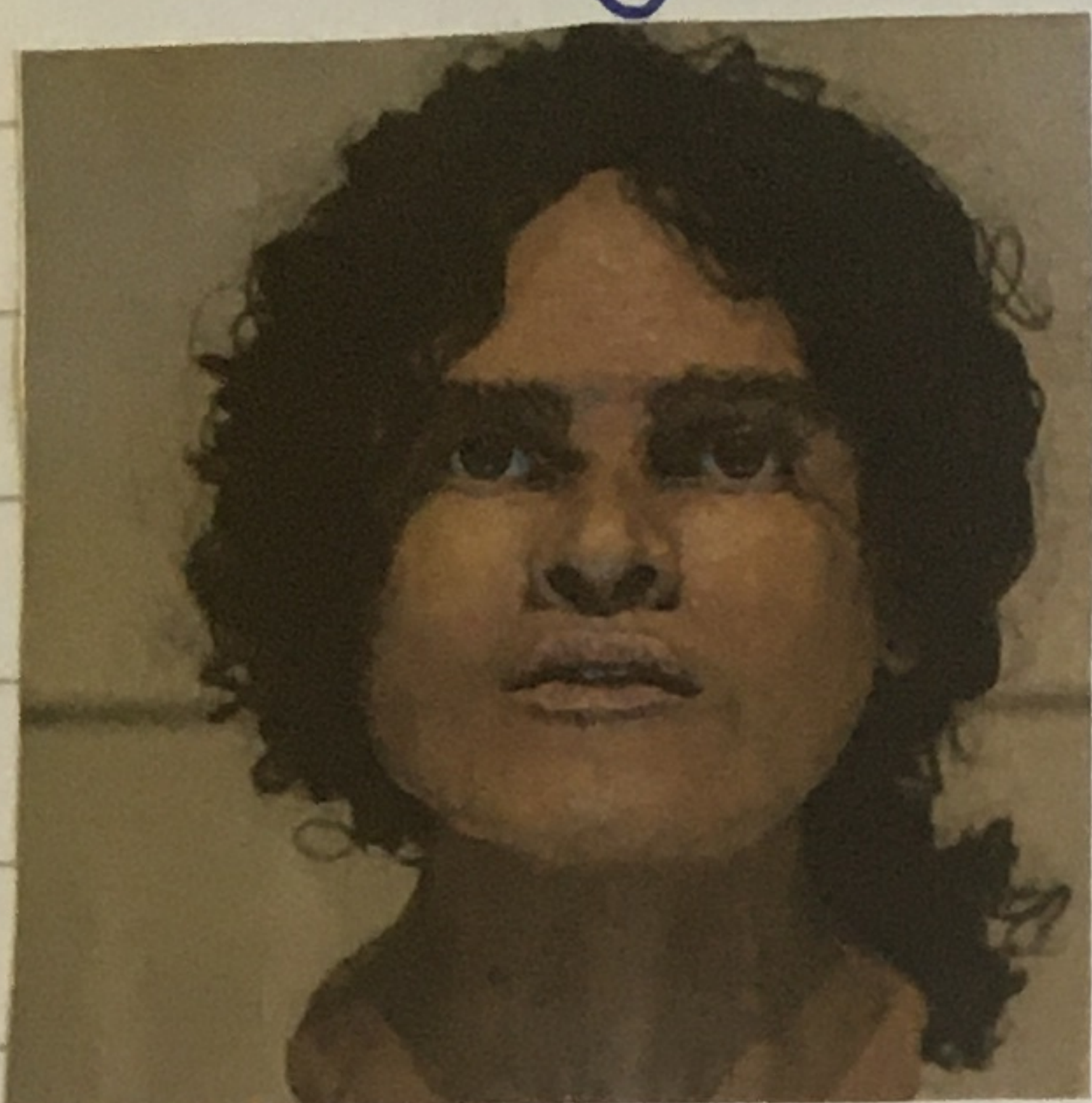


John Blanke was the first black Briton whose name and picture was recorded. He was a trumpeter who performed for King Henry VII and Henry VIII. His picture is on a 60ft long scroll of a tournament. ^{Some} Black people ^{and upper class} were not discriminated by Royalty in 1500s. There was a large need for a male heir to create a 60ft scroll.



Joseph Johnson was a 19th Century London beggar who wore a toy ship on his head and sang songs. ~~It~~ Joseph Johnson, along with his friend Billy Water, were ex-navy toy beggars with naught to go. ~~Pe~~ We can learn people returning from the navy have a hard time. People enjoyed hearing songs from a man with a ship on their head and some black people decided life was better on the streets than being a slave.

Beachy Head Lady:

- discovered in East Sussex 1953
- lived in Roman period, around AD245
- good diet and teeth and bones in good condition

- Most people around then had good diets
- people were able to go from over seas
- She had a good life



John Blanke:

- first black Briton to have their name and picture documented

- A trumpeter at courts for both

King Henrys in 1511 - not many black people were documented - ^{black} people were treated equal for a bit



Joseph Johnson:

- 19th century London beggar and ^{used to be a} sailor
- Famed for wearing a model ship on his hat while singing patriotic songs
- hailed as 'King of beggars'
- Not all black people in Britain were

seen as property - A lot of black people now lived in Britain now, around 20 000 - 25 000

Black History

Things that surprised me:

- When reading about the Jamaica Coffee House, I was surprised that they would name a coffee shop in Britain after the acquisition.
- When reading about the Africa House, I was very surprised that it was written as if the slaves were property instead of people.
- When reading about St Martins-in-the-Fields, I was surprised that slaves were sold in bought and sold in regular coffee shops. 'Later, coffee shops existed here, where Asians and Africans were bought and sold.'
