




WHEN THEY LIVED & DIED



Most mammoth populations had died around 10,000 years ago although a small population of 500-1000 woolly mammoths lived on an Island in the Arctic until 1650 BC. This was approximately 1000 years after the pyramids at Giza were built. The woolly mammoths lived half 1 million years ago.

Some experts think Mammoths were hunted until they were extinct by the humans.


