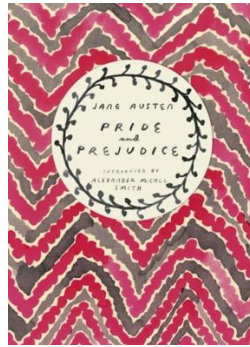


Year 7 English
